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Jobs may include but aren't restricted to:

Building farm structures (hoop, sheds, & chicken houses), moving dirt, pots, or compost, painting (old clothes), digging holes, hand planting of trees and shrubs, weeding, mowing, fence building, sorting, selling books, grafting, cleaning, removing debris, i.e. doing odd jobs related to tree farming (planting, grafting, trimming, and weeding), gardening, light farming, and home maintenance. Protective clothing, coats, insulating head gear, long pants, socks, shoes, long sleeve shirts are needed. Protective eye wear will be provided as needed.

Normal warnings for farm work: You can hurt yourself. Simple tools like a shovel, saw, mower, tiller, or post hole digger can cut off toes or fingers. Gravity can hurt you. You can fall. Trees, tools, heavy objects can drop and hurt you. Never pull cutting tools toward yourself or operate power equipment without training and the buddy system. Motors short to the frame, electricity and moisture don't mix, metal surfaces can be electrically dangerous. If you are diabetic, walking through poison ivy can actually kill you!! (they don't show that in books and for very good reason!).
